

Regular Council Meeting
City of Tallulah
May 13, 2021

A regular council meeting of the Mayor and City Council was held on Thursday, May 13, 2021, 2020 at 5:30 P. M., in the Council Room Chamber of Tallulah City Hall.

Mayor Charles M. Finlayson called the meeting to order, led the Pledge of Allegiance, and asked for a moment of silent prayer.

During public comments on the agenda, private citizen Michael Claiborne approached the council regarding cleaning culverts. Mayor Finlayson asked Mr. Claiborne to contact him after the meeting to give him the streets he was references for culvert cleaning. There were no public comments on the agenda content.

Motion to approve the Minutes of the April 22, 2021 council meeting was made by Councilman Whitney and seconded by Councilwoman Day. The motion carried with no opposition.

Motion to approve the council meeting dates for June 2021 to June 9, 2021 and June 23 was made by Councilman Sims and seconded by Councilman Robinson. The motion carried with no opposition.


Motion to approve a Municipal Lease for New Tractor for the Sewer Plant was made by Councilwoman Day and seconded by Councilman Whitney. The City will agree to a lease/purchase agreement at a cost of \$55,429.50 for five years.

Mayor Finlayson updated the council on his trip to Baton Rouge. He told the council that he met with various Northeast Louisiana Mayors and with Governor Edwards. Mayor Pro Tem Sims told the council that the group spoke about the Tallulah Industrial Parkway. Sims said that Senator Katrina Jackson like the idea of the project and expressed her support. Both Finlayson and Sims said that the City will continue seeking avenues for funding for the project.

Tallulah Police Department Chief Buster McCoy informed the council that the driveway into the police department bay needs some concrete work. Mayor Finlayson advised that the work will be done in the near future.

With no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Councilman Whitney and seconded by Councilwoman Day. The motion carried with no opposition.
